Healthy Cities Initiative: Tobacco-Free Communities Grant Awarded

As part of the Fiscal Year 2018-19 Work Program, Council directed staff to work on tobacco-free policies and regulations to meet the Healthy Cities Initiative standards. To accomplish this, staff applied for Tobacco-Free Communities grant funding from the Santa Clara County Public Health Department to develop policies that decrease youth access to tobacco and tobacco-flavored products. On November 5, the City was selected to receive funding. The final funding amount will be determined after negotiations regarding scope of work and budget take place, however, the County anticipates being able to provide the full amount requested, \$48,608.

Save the Date for Cupertino's Small Business Saturday Celebration on Saturday, November 24

The City, in conjunction with Main Street Cupertino, will host its third annual Small Business Saturday Celebration on Saturday, November 24 from noon – 3:00 p.m. at Main Street Cupertino's Town Square. This special community celebration will feature free family fun activities, including live music by The Big Dreamers, children's activities, and discounts and giveaways by local businesses to encourage local shopping and dining. The first 200 attendees will receive free limited-edition "Shop Small" canvas tote bags.

Heroes Run

The 6th annual Heroes Run was held Saturday November 3 at the Cupertino Civic Center. Support by the Public Works Department's Streets Division staff helped setup and staff the various street closures related to this event. This annual event is produced by the Santa Clara County Sheriff's Office, Santa Clara County Fire Department, Santa Clara Valley Medical Center, and the Valley Medical Center Foundation. The event started in 2013, to provide a fun and healthy activity for the community, while raising muchneeded funds that directly benefit children's health services at Santa Clara Valley Medical Center. Activities included a 5K run, Superhero kids fun run, Hero Dash obstacle course, and a kids and family costume contest. This annual event draws 1000plus participants each year.

Residential Food Scraps Collection: Visual Audits & Outreach Project with De Anza College

To fulfill a volunteering requirement in their "Introduction to Environmental Health" course at De Anza College, three students are assisting Cupertino Environmental Programs Staff to conduct targeted outreach to single-family residential homes to increase diversion of food scraps and food-soiled paper from the landfill. As part of this

pilot project, students and staff perform visual "lid flip" audits of about 400 anonymous organics carts in 4 four randomly selected neighborhoods. Some neighborhoods received informational door hangers. Three neighborhood audits have already been completed, with the last one scheduled for next week. All four neighborhoods will receive postaudits in late November and early December and will be invited to participate in a survey to help staff evaluate pilot success. This data will inform future outreach and education strategies in the pursuit of landfill diversion goals and laws. (Photos are attached below of our student volunteers in action)


