Housing Commission Vacancies and Alternates

Housing Commissioner John Zhao resigned from the Commission effective July 25. In January, Council appointed Sanjiv Kapil as the Commission's first alternate and he will fill the vacancy as per Council resolution. Sanjiv will attend the regularly scheduled meeting in September. The resignation letter from John Zhao is attached. On July 16, Council amended Chapter 2.86 of the Cupertino Municipal Code eliminating the Financial Representative position requirement. In January, Council appointed Siva Gandikota as the Commission's second alternate and he will fill the vacancy left by former Financial Representative Poonam Goyal. Siva will attend the regularly scheduled meeting in September after the ordinance goes into effect.

McClellan Road Separated Bikeway - Construction Update

Construction of the separated bike lane between Stelling Road and Imperial Avenue will have some work activities extend into the beginning of the school year. Conditions beyond the control of the City and the contractor have caused the project to extend to mid-September. Public Works staff are working very closely with the contractor who is making every attempt to complete the project as soon as possible.

For the first day of school this Thursday, August 15, all existing bike lanes will be available at the beginning of the school day until after the students are in class. After 9 a.m., unfinished work activities will resume and vehicle/bicycle/ped traffic will be impacted. At the end of the school day, existing bike lanes may be closed intermittently, and cyclists may need to share the road. All necessary traffic control signage is in place. Updated project schedule information has been communicated to the schools. Included in this information is a reminder to students to walk their bikes on the sidewalks if there are pedestrians present. Cyclists 12 years of age and under may (per City ordinance) ride their bicycles on sidewalks. Cyclists 13 years of age and over, if they are not comfortable using the bike lanes or "Share the Road", are advised to walk their bikes on the sidewalk.

Public Works will have "cycling chaperones" to assist students during the morning commute and/or dismissal time. These chaperones will act as guides modeling how to cycle the area. In addition, a maintenance worker will be at the intersection of Stelling & McClellan to assist with crossing guard duties in addition to the regular crossing guard stationed at the intersection of Bubb & McClellan. County Deputies will also be patrolling the area both prior to the first bell and after the last bell.

The following is a summary of construction activities for next two weeks: Week of August 12:

- Driveways on the south side of the street will be installed. Expect intermittent bike lane impacts during this installation.
- On the south side of the street the existing bike lane striping will remain as-is. There may be intermittent construction activity that will require cyclists to share-the-road.
- On the north side of the street the vehicle lane will have additional width, the bike lane will be opened but not be marked with a stripe.

Week of August 19:

- The contractor will begin installing the concrete island to separate the vehicle lane from the bike lane. Expected duration 7-10 days.
- During construction of the concrete islands, the bike lanes will be impacted. Bicycle traffic will need to share the road.
- Once the concrete islands are installed there will be protected bike lanes in both directions.
- The contractor will still be performing work so there may be intermittent impacts to the bike lane.

Please note that schedule is subject to change.

Community Funding Grant Awarded to Heart of the Valley

On July 11, 2019, the Cupertino Parks and Recreation Commission awarded the Community Funding Grant to Heart of the Valley, a local organization that serves seniors 65+ living independently in Cupertino.

The grant will fund Heart of the Valley's "Reaching Hearts at Home" outreach project, which will aim to spread awareness of the services Heart of the Valley provides, educate seniors on the ease and benefits of their services, communicate how their services supplement existing senior services, and improve the quality of life for seniors in Cupertino. The services they provide often make the difference between a senior living independently and requiring assisted living. They support a more active life and increase well-being and health, and they engage seniors with Heart of the Valley's friendly neighbor volunteers. Attached is a letter Heart of the Valley wrote to the Parks and Recreation Commission.

This workshop, "Using Data to Drive Business Growth," will teach attendees how to analyze trends to better engage customers online and how to incorporate data into a marketing plan. National Night Out (NNO) Event a Success

On Tuesday, August 6, 38 Neighborhoods throughout Cupertino registered to participate in the 36th Annual National Night Out. National Night Out encourages neighborhoods to come together to build community within their neighborhood; increase crime prevention and safety awareness; and strengthen the partnership between community, city, and emergency responders.

Registered neighborhoods celebrated in a variety of different ways. Some by hosting pot lucks, book exchanges, ice cream socials, meet and greets, and participating in the photo scavenger hunt organized by city staff. It was a fun night for all involved and a great success.

Many neighborhoods were visited by Neighborhood Watch Coordinator Steffanie Turini, Community Relations Coordinator Laura Lee, Santa Clara County Sheriff's Office, and Santa Clara County Fire personnel.

Recycling Day & Confidential Document Shredding Saturday, Aug. 17

The City and Recology invite Cupertino residents to participate in a free document shredding and recycling event this Saturday between 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. at De Anza College. Drop off unwanted materials for responsible reuse and recycling. This event accepts confidential documents (shredded onsite), gently used clothing, plastic toys and play structures, yard trimmings, construction material, small appliances, TVs, computers, monitors, printers, and other universal waste (batteries, CFLs, and fluorescent tubes). This event is a key component of the City's vision for a Zero Waste community. There will be one more quarterly event in 2019, scheduled for the same time and location, on Saturday, November 9.

Larry Way and Randy Lane Streetlight Outreach

On June 26, 2019, the Public Works Department held a public meeting for the property owners along Randy Lane and Larry Way in order to gather input regarding the proposed streetlight infill project proposed for this neighborhood. At the meeting, the City committed to mailing a ballot to each property along the two streets, in order to provide property owners an opportunity to have their voice heard.

The City sent ballots on July 8, 2019 and required they be returned by July 31, 2019. These ballots provided the following options:

- 1) Are you For or Against installation of additional streetlights on Randy Lane and Larry Way?;
- 2) What type of streetlights do you prefer? (i.e. Lights on existing PG&E wood poles or new metal streetlight poles)

On August 1, 2019, City staff from the City Clerk's office and the Public Works Department opened and tallied ballots. The ballot results are as follows:

Cumulative vote results (of the 68 properties that received ballots)

- 46 responses received (68% response ratio)
- 33 Yes votes to add streetlights (72% approval ratio of received votes)
- 26 Votes for Streetlights on wooden PG&E poles.


Based on the majority vote, the City will collaborate with PG&E to initiate the installation of streetlights on the PG&E owned wooden poles where feasible. The City does not currently have a schedule for completion of this project but will provide updates as they become available. Updates will be available here.

Second Annual Touch-a-Truck Event

On August 1, 2019, Public Works collaborated with Parks and Recreation on the second annual "Touch-a-Truck" event. Recreation staff coordinates groups of children to visit with Public Works staff and view Public Works trucks driven on-site at Quinlan Community Center back parking lot. Public Works employees explain the functions of each truck, and the type of work

performed in using them. The highlight of the event is when a Tree Maintenance Worker will go up in the aerial lift and fly paper airplanes that the children made prior to the event.

Accela Land Management System Goes Live

The City of Cupertino went live with Accela Land Management system on July 22. This Enterprise System is used by Building, Planning, and Public Works staff for permit process automation, including the assignment of tasks, tracking of reviews, and sending notifications to keep the permit processes running smoothly and on schedule. Staff uses this system to manage the development of permits, automate and track plan reviews, zone variance requests, and manage building inspections. Through Accela's mobile app, Building Inspectors manage their schedules, upload captured information, view the City's data in real time, and complete and result inspections from the field. This system integrates with New World Financial System, ProjectDox Electronic Plan Check System, Laserfiche Electronic Content Management System, and City's ArcGIS.

Cupertino also launched its new online portal for residents, contractors, and businesses to apply for permits, submit documents, receive notifications, pay fees and schedule building inspections 24/7.


Through the Online Permit Portal users can:

- Apply, pay, and receive Building permits for Electrical Panel, Furnace Replacement, Re-Roof, Siding Replacement, Water Heater Replacement and Whole House re-pipe
- Schedule building inspections
- Apply for Planning permits for Special Events, Temporary Sign and Zoning Verification
- Apply for Public Works permits for Encroachment, Grading, Miscellaneous and Revocable Encroachment
- Pay for permits and inspection fees online
- Track application status
- Lookup property information
- Log code violations or requests for service
- Print records

This project was managed by the City's IT Applications Division. Applications staff worked with Building, Planning, and Public Works staff twos, dedicating countless hours of requirements, gathering, business process analysis, system configuration, data conversion, testing, and training to roll out Accela Implementation successfully.


