# August 17 Environmental Day Recycling and Shredding Event Summary

The third annual "Environmental Recycling Day and Shred It Event" was held on Saturday, August 17, between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. at De Anza College. This quarterly event, sponsored by Recology, offers Cupertino residents a free opportunity to shred confidential documents and drop off e-waste, bulky goods, and other unwanted materials for responsible reuse and recycling. This year's event had an unprecedented attendance of 782 participants. Typical attendance is approximately 500, with the last event in April resulting in 309 residents using the service. As a result of the significant uptick in attendance, demand for collection and shredding exceeded capacity and some residents were unable to receive service. Recology reported that one factor was residents bringing more than the program limit of two boxes of documents and/or making multiple trips. In an effort to accommodate those unable to drop off their bulky items at the event, the City and Recology offered an on-call bulky item collection from their homes at no charge.

This event was publicized on the City website and through various social media outlets, which resulted in more than 5,100 people being reached, based on metrics provided by the City's

Communications Office. City and Recology staff are evaluating adjustments in the program for future events which include vehicle circulation, additional shredding/collection vehicles, and outreach strategies. These challenges will be effectively addressed going forward before the next event scheduled for November 9.

# **Demonstration Garden Ribbon Cutting Ceremony**

On August 22, the City of Cupertino held a ribbon cutting ceremony and guided tour of the City Hall Demonstration Garden. Switching to drought-tolerant plants has saved the City water and maintenance expenses. The Demonstration Garden is a place to learn about how to care for each plant, discover how tall they may grow, see pictures, and more.

Thanks to everyone who helped make the garden a success, including the City Council, Sustainability Division, Public Works Department, the GIS team, as well as supporting partners from the Sustainability Commission and Santa Clara Valley Water District.

# Process Update: Projects Outside the Annual CIP Process

As a follow up to the Council study session of August 20, 2019, the flowchart for projects outside the annual CIP process has been updated. The update reflects Council's request that those projects receive Planning Commission consideration for conformance with the General Plan, as required by the Cupertino Municipal Code. Please refer to the attached diagram.

# **Cupertino Ties for Best Street Network in the Region**

In September, the Bay Area Metropolitan Transportation Commission will release Pavement Condition Index (PCI) data for all cities in the nine-county Bay Area region. For 2018, Cupertino received a PCI value of 85 out of 100. This value ties Cupertino with the cities of Palo Alto and Dublin for best street network in the region. Over the last several years, the City has implemented an aggressive maintenance program to improve the condition of our street network. With a PCI of 85, the City will be able to maintain the street network by applying a variety of less-costly preventative maintenance treatments, as opposed to more costly structural treatments. By applying the right treatment at the right time, annual expenditures are reduced, and PCI can be maintained. As this is a significant achievement, Public Works is coordinating with the City Manager's Office regarding a press and social media release.

# City Launches Queue Management System at the Permit Center

The City went live in April with QLess, an online queue management system, which provides better service and support to Permit Center customers. Customers can check-in using the iPad kiosk to consult with staff from Building, Planning, Public Works, and Environmental Programs.


Once the customer signs in for service, they receive a text notification of the estimated wait time, followed by notifications on their queue. The accurate wait time allows customers to manage their schedule efficiently. In addition, this system provides a public dashboard that lists all queued up customers and their wait times.


Correspondingly, the application interface allows permit technicians and counter staff to log in and manage the customers by summoning them, serving them, tracking their service details, and moving them to the other department queues, if necessary.

This system also provides a robust reporting capability by generating various reports like "Average Service Wait Time by Specific Queue" and "Numbers of Customers Served" within any given time interval. This allows staff to track wait times and ensure that it improves the process moving forward. Furthermore, QLess has allowed the Permit Center to transition to a paperless customer intake process, customer wait management, and reporting.


The City's IT Applications Division, along with Community Development, Public Works, and IT Infrastructure staff managed the implementation and rollout of this System.

#### **Kiosk Intake Screens:**




