Plan Bay Area 2050 Officially Kicks Off

Plan Bay Area 2050 is a long-range plan charting the course for the future of the nine-county San Francisco Bay Area and focusing on four key issues—the economy, the environment, housing, and transportation. The plan will identify a path to make the Bay Area more equitable for all residents and more resilient in the face of unexpected challenges. The new regional plan will outline strategies for growth and investment through the year 2050, while simultaneously striving to meet and exceed federal and state requirements. The Metropolitan Transportation Commission and the Association of Bay Area Governments are expected to adopt Plan Bay Area 2050 in summer 2021.

The Plan Bay Area 2050 development process has officially begun. The attached flyer has information on a variety of ways to learn about the plan and contribute to the discussion. The first issue of the Plan Bay Area 2050 monthly newsletter can be found here:

Annual Pavement Maintenance Project

As part of Cupertino's annual pavement maintenance project, the first phase began Monday, September 9 and is scheduled to be completed by October 31. Phase 1 will include 41 street segments (see the 2019 pavement list attached). These streets will receive a 2" asphalt overlay

treatment. Modifications will be made to some streets in preparation for new bike boulevard upgrades. The contractor for this project is G. Bortolotto & Company. Should you have any questions regarding this project, please contact Jo Anne Johnson at joannej@cupertino.org.

Save the Date: Public Outreach Event on Energy & Sustainability Building Codes on October 16

In California, Title 24 of the Code of Regulations sets the building code standards for all jurisdictions statewide. However, local governments can adopt more stringent requirements, known as reach codes, which are enforced in the building permit process. City Council has directed the Sustainability Commission to propose green reach codes that would support the City's Climate Action Plan. The Commission is working with regional partners at Silicon Valley Clean Energy (SVCE) and their technical advisors to take part in regional efforts around the building code update.

Save the date for a public outreach event, scheduled for October 16, 2019, at 6:00 p.m. in Community Hall (10350 Torre Avenue, Cupertino). City staff and consultants will give an overview of the reach codes under consideration. Representatives from Silicon Valley Clean Energy and PG&E will be present to answer any questions, and members of the public will be encouraged to bring your questions and feedback as staff considers this important opportunity. More information will be posted to the City website in coming days.

September 2019 RAWG Update: Plan Bay Area 2050 Officially Kicks Off!

Kicking Off Plan Bay Area 2050

We're excited to announce that the Plan Bay Area 2050 development process has officially begun! Plan Bay Area 2050 will serve as the Bay Area's roadmap through the year 2050 as the region wrestles with economic, environmental, housing and transportation issues, while also identifying a path to a more equitable and resilient Bay Area in the face of unexpected challenges. Importantly, it will focus on integrating resilient strategies from Horizon and on prioritizing equitable outcomes. We hope you will join in and be a part of what will be a vibrant process that will help shape the Bay Area for decades to come.

The first step of Plan Bay Area 2050 will be to integrate key findings and strategies from the predecessor Horizon initiative into the Draft Blueprint (previously referred to as the Preferred Scenario). RAWG will play a key role in the months ahead, providing input on each of the 4 elements of the Draft Blueprint: Transportation, Housing, the Economy, and the Environment.

Here are some ways you or your organization can get involved in the process in the near term:

- **Participate in one or more webinars**, including the official Plan Bay Area 2050 launch webinar on Thursday, September 5 (see below).
- **Join us for the September RAWG meeting**, where we will be discussing the timeline for the planning process and how Horizon deliverables will be integrated this fall.
- **Join us for the first Regional Equity Working Group (REWG) meeting** on Wednesday, September 18, if you would like to engage in integrating equity throughout the Plan.

- **Provide feedback on the Plan Bay Area 2050 Regional Growth Forecast Methodology** at the ABAG Executive Board public hearing on Thursday, September 19 ([more information](#)).
- **Help us publicize pop-up workshops this fall** – we'll be in 20 to 30 different communities across the Bay Area to refine the shortlist of resilient strategies identified by Horizon. Locations will be posted on the project website in the coming weeks.

What's on the Agenda This Month at RAWG?

At the regular RAWG meeting on Tuesday, September 10, staff will provide an overview of the Plan Bay Area 2050 process, highlighting the proposed Vision and Guiding Principles previously developed with input from the public, stakeholders and elected officials through Horizon. In addition, RAWG members will be formally invited to participate in the parallel Regional Equity Working Group (REWG) process; a high-level overview of equity integration into the Plan will be provided. Lastly, a proposed path forward for a combined Priority Development Area (PDA)/ One Bay Area Grant Program (OBAG) will also be discussed at the meeting.
