News and Updates Regarding COVID-19

City Communications Regarding COVID-19 (Coronavirus)

The City of Cupertino continues to monitor the effects of the coronavirus (COVID-19) as the safety of our residents remains our highest priority. All City facilities remain closed until further notice. While City Hall is closed to the public, the City continues to provide essential services online at <u>cupertino.org</u> and by phone at (408) 777-3200. These essential services include responding to 311 requests and maintaining the City's infrastructure, among others. Updates to State of California Stay-at-Home Order

On July 13, Governor Newsom announced that a number of indoor activities and industries will be closed statewide, and additional indoor activities and industries will be closed in counties that appear on the State's "monitoring list" for three days or longer. Cupertino Walgreens Offering Free COVID-19 Testing

The Cupertino Walgreens at 20011 Bollinger Road is now offering free, drive-thru COVID-19 testing. Testing is available seven days a week from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. with no appointment required. Individuals must be 18 and older and do not need to have health insurance.

The nasal swab test is self-administered and does not test for antibodies. When you arrive at Walgreens, follow the signs and bring a valid ID and insurance card if you have insurance. Results will be available in three to four days.



City Launches New Contract Management System

The City of Cupertino went live with the Cobblestone Contract Management System last month. This new system provides an end-to-end solution to manage Citywide contracts and vendors. Important system features include contract templates, tracking, legal hold, e-notifications, task schedules, and checklists for contract administrators, workflows, easier searching, and custom and build-in reporting.

The system also offers a Vendor Collaboration Portal found <u>here</u>. Vendors accessing this portal can easily view the City's open public contracts and can communicate and share documents with the City's contract administrators, thus streamlining the contract negotiation process.

City to Extend Trial Period of Dog Off-Leash Area at Jollyman Park

The City of Cupertino is extending the trial period for the dog off-leash area (<u>DOLA</u>) at Jollyman Park in order to acquire sufficient data to assess how effectively youth sports and a DOLA can coexist. The extension, as well as updated hours, was approved by the Parks and Recreation Commission at its <u>meeting on July 2</u>.

"The City has received continuous feedback affirming how much users have enjoyed the DOLA during this trial period," said Joanne Magrini, Parks and Recreation Department Director. "The Department and Commission believe the opportunity to extend the trial period will ensure that

adequate outreach and research has been conducted, which will benefit DOLA users, neighbors, youth sports participants, and the Cupertino community."

The DOLA trial began on October 1, 2019 and was intended to run through July 31, 2020. The trial ceased from March 24 to June 4 due to the COVID-19 pandemic and accompanying Shelter-in-Place orders. The DOLA resumed on June 5, 2020 in accordance with state and county guidelines. Currently, the state is prohibiting youth sports and games.

New DOLA hours will go into effect on August 1. For updates and more information, visit <u>cupertino.org/dola</u>.

Cupertino Sports Center to Remain Closed Through December 2020

The Cupertino Sports Center requires a seismic retrofit to meet current state-regulated earthquake standards. This construction is set to begin in early September 2020 and is expected to be completed in December 2020. The nature of this interior work necessitates the closure of the Sports Center building during this time. In consideration of the current state and county recommendations to prevent the spread of COVID-19, and the many restrictions required to accommodate a reopening, the Sports Center will remain closed through December 2020.

The Sports Center tennis courts will remain open when feasible during this period. Sports Center members will receive an email in the coming weeks with regards to the status of their memberships and additional information regarding the extended closure.

City of Cupertino Wins CAPIO Epic Award

The City of Cupertino, per the request of the City Council, held its first Community Budget Workshop on April 18, 2019. The City promoted the event through a #BudgetBites campaign on Facebook and Instagram and partnered with the Teen Commission and Youth Activity Board for additional marketing.

The Administrative Services Department, with the assistance of the Office of Communications, applied for a California Association of Public Information Officials (CAPIO) Excellence in Public Information and Communications (EPIC) Award in the category of Community Relations/Participation. The City won the award, which recognized the City for its partnership with the community's teens.
