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City Releasing Daily Report Regarding COVID-19 (Coronavirus)

The City of Cupertino continues to monitor the effects of the COVID-19 (coronavirus) as the safety of our residents remains our highest priority. In an effort to ensure that our residents, businesses, and visitors are up to date, the City is now releasing a daily report regarding COVID-19. A report will be posted each weekday at 5:00 p.m. The report features news about the cancellation/postponement of events, helpful online City services, and information on City operations. The reports will be uploaded to www.cupertino.org/coronavirus. If you would like to receive an email notification each time the reports are published, visit the webpage and sign up for an eNotification.

Cupertino 311: The City's Online Service-Request Tool

The City of Cupertino is encouraging residents to utilize online services to limit in-person interactions, as recommended by the Center for Disease Control and Prevention and the County of Santa Clara Public Health to help slow the spread of COVID-19 (coronavirus).

Cupertino 311 gives residents the opportunity to report potholes that need to be filled, trees that need to be trimmed, trash that needs to be picked up, and graffiti that needs to be removed, among other issues. The tool also allows for greater transparency, accountability, and efficiency:

- The public can view issues reported to the City and read staff's responses. (Sensitive matters will continue to remain private.)
- The system allows a user to see existing requests on a map and either add a new request by location or comment on an existing issue.
- The system has a powerful management system that allows the City to route citizen requests directly to the staff tasked with fixing the problem.
- CitySourced technology integrates into Cupertino's asset management system, giving staff the ability to seamlessly move submitted requests to assigned workers in the field.

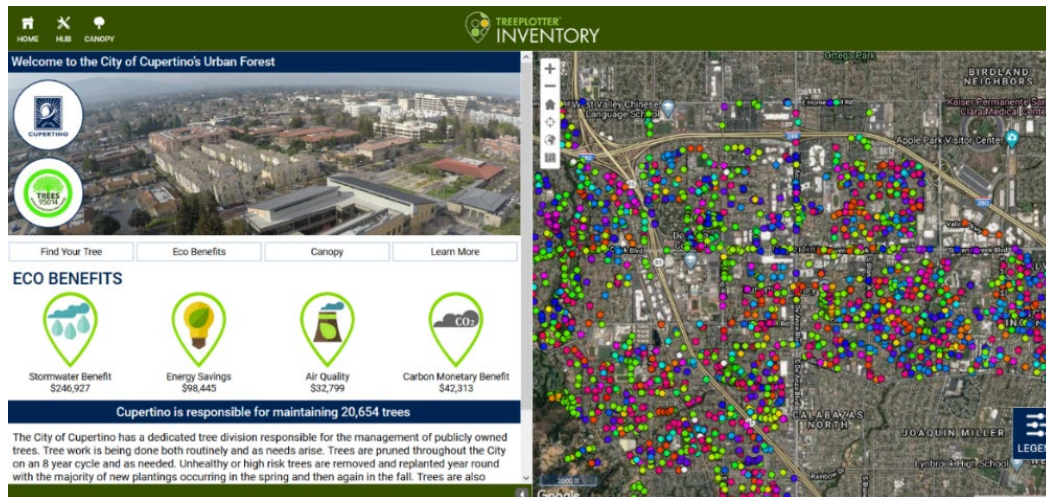


Cupertino Named Tree City USA and Recognized with Growth Award

For nearly a decade, the City of Cupertino has won multiple awards every year for its efforts in promoting and maintaining a healthy urban forest. The City's accomplishments continue to grow as the Arbor Day Foundation has named Cupertino Tree City USA for the eighth consecutive year. Additionally, the City received the Growth Award for the sixth time.

Activities that led to the City receiving the 2019 Tree City USA distinction include two public planting events, 188 new trees planted, 3,387 trees pruned, and significant outreach efforts to educate our citizens and increase awareness about the importance of urban forestry.

Activities that led to the City receiving the 2019 Growth Award distinction include enhancing the asset management system with tree inventory and analysis, along with the ongoing efforts of public education and public relations. For the Inventory and Analysis recognition, the Public Works Department coordinated with the City's Geographic Information Systems (GIS) Division in contracting for a re-inventory of City trees on the GIS database. This information made it possible to organize and track work performed effectively, as well as prioritize tree maintenance operations efficiently. For the Education and Public Relations recognition, Public Works coordinated with GIS again to develop an interactive web page (www.cupertino.org/trees) that provides valuable information to our residents. The web page has tools that assist with determining planting areas and growth modeling. The site also provides current canopy cover and eco benefits information.



Work to Begin at McClellan Ranch Preserve Community Garden

A Public Works project to revitalize McClellan Ranch Preserve is set to build a new community garden beginning this spring. The new McClellan Ranch Preserve Community Garden will include 93 raised planter beds, six in-ground plots, eight ADA raised planter beds, and five Master Gardener raised beds. The project will also include a new irrigation system, which will provide a hose bibb at every plot, four storage sheds, a shade structure, two picnic tables, and new perimeter fencing. Underground wire mesh will be incorporated into perimeter fence and under each plot to deter the intrusion of burrowing animals. Following standard procedure when

building in preserved areas, the City's Public Works Department engaged the services of a biologist to conduct bird surveys on February 28 and March 6. No active bird nests were found and, as a result, the project will begin construction on Monday, March 16 with a City contracted biologist monitoring activities. Barring any delays due to rain or other unknown conditions, the project will be complete by approximately July 4. If this schedule holds, volunteer activities to construct raised planter beds, fill beds with topsoil, and distribute mulch around the beds will also occur in July.

Compost Site 2020 Season

The City provides our community an annual opportunity to pick up bulk garden compost at no charge for their home landscaping use. The compost is made available at the City's compost site, 12100 Stevens Canyon Road, across from the Stevens Creek Dam parking lot. The site is scheduled to open on Friday, March 27 and close for the season on Saturday, November 14. The site is open to residents, when conditions allow, on Friday and Saturday mornings between 8:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. Cupertino residents must bring proof of residency and have bags, buckets, or other containers to load the compost into their vehicles. Open vehicles such as pick-up trucks and utility trailers must have tarps to cover the load. There is no City staff to assist in loading the compost, so residents should have the proper tools such as gloves and shovels. It is important to note that the site will be closed if it is raining or has recently rained and the site is unable to be accessed due to mud. Cupertino Parks and Recreation Department Wins Awards

Every year District 4 of the California Parks and Recreation Society (CPRS) holds the Annual Awards and Volunteer Recreation Dinner, which honors outstanding individuals for their professional and volunteer contributions to the files of parks, recreation, and human services. This year, the Cupertino Parks and Recreation Department (CPRD) had the honor of receiving two awards in the categories of the *Volunteer & Sponsor Citation Awards* and two awards in the *Award of Excellence Category*.

In the *Volunteer & Sponsor Citation Award* the following two volunteers were recognized for their voluntary contribution of time and effort to recreation, park, and human services programs:

- **Delphine Ng**, one of the Senior Center's most active volunteers who has averaged over 1,100 hours per year in the five years she has been volunteering. Delphine teaches two ukulele classes at our Senior Center, leads the *HarmoniKatz* volunteer band, hosts at least four free concerts at our center yearly (and plenty more around the community) and is the shining jewel of the Senior Center volunteer corps.
- **Rose Lin**, a 10-year veteran of the Senior Center volunteer corps who assists with the popular birthday bash monthly luncheons.



The *Award of Excellence* Category recognizes outstanding projects or programs in the categories of recreation programming, promoting healthy communities, parks planning, and facility design. The award serves to recognize and promote agency successes, new creative approaches, and best practices. The following CPRD programs were awarded the *Award of Excellence*:

- **Signing Santa** is the first of its kind in the Bay Area and provided an opportunity for deaf and hard-of-hearing children to talk to Santa using sign language. The goal of this event was to serve an underserved community and provide holiday magic for kids who may not have experienced a face-to-face conversation with Santa before. Attendees had the opportunity to enjoy free crafts, cookies and hot cocoa, and spend quality time with Santa.
- **<hack> Cupertino** is a 13-hour overnight hackathon event where youth ages 13-18 collaborate and utilize their coding knowledge to create an app to solve a unique problem presented during the opening ceremony. This event was created to increase teen engagement through an educational platform, improve teen wellness, and use technology to solve issues facing the City of Cupertino.

The Better Part TV Production 2020 W.A.V.E. Awards

The Cupertino Senior Center's The Better Part TV Production volunteer group had three finalists in this year's Western Access Video Excellence (W.A.V.E.) awards held in Monterey on Thursday, February 20. The W.A.V.E. awards ceremony is held annually for Community Media, Western Region Conference which covers six U.S. states: Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Nevada, and New Mexico.



“Art in Air” won first place in the category of Talk Show and was produced by Adek Hanukai and edited by Jerry Oliver. Adek is a relatively new member of The Better Part group and this was his first award. “Spartan Robotics – We are 971” won first place in the category of Educational Access and was produced by Val Jeffery and edited by Jerry Oliver. “Robots and Their Young Masters” was a finalist in the category of Underserved Voices and was produced by Val Jeffery and edited by Jerry Oliver.

Bike Boulevard Phase 2 Project Update

Staff members from the City’s Transportation Division have spent the past several months meeting with concerned residents regarding the Bike Boulevard Phase 2 Project. Pop-up bicycle channelizers, or bollards, are to be installed in this phase. Similar bollards have recently been installed along the Bike Boulevard Phase 1 route at the intersections of Portal Avenue/Amherst Drive, Vista Drive/Merritt Drive, and Greenleaf Drive/Beardon Drive as pictured below.



The route of the Phase 2 Project includes Calle de Barcelona, Finch Avenue, Tilson Avenue, Wunderlich Drive, and Barnhart Avenue, as shown in the map below. Individual property owners fronting the pop-up improvements are being contacted to ensure they are informed prior to installation of the bollards, which should occur through April.



- Bollards for the Bike Boulevard Phase 3 Project, if included as a feature of the Project, is scheduled to be finished by September 2020 after community outreach is completed. Once all three phases of bollards are installed, City staff will review effectiveness and consider resident comments. If the bollards are considered effective and positive to the residents, the temporary installation of the bollards will be replaced with permanent concrete curb barriers. This permanent project will be considered by the City Council during the FY 2020-2021 budget process.
