2019 has seen an increased sense of urgency among the scientific community and local policy makers, expressing the need to take actions in the absence of U.S. national leadership on climate and environmental issues. In Cupertino, this was expressed by local youth participating in the Silicon Valley Climate Strike in September, and by a wave of grassroots movements.

The City of Cupertino's <u>Climate Action Plan</u> defines Cupertino's path toward creating a healthy, livable, and vibrant place for its current and future residents to live, learn, work, and play. <u>Learn more</u> about how Cupertino is meeting its 2020 greenhouse gas emissions reduction goals. The <u>2019 Beacon Award</u> from the Institute for Local Government recognized Cupertino's holistic approach to addressing climate change. Cupertino also received an overall Score of B for the 2018 CDP Climate Action Scorecard, ranking it well above average of participating cities for climate action and information disclosure.

Capping off an exciting 2019 is the <u>building reach code</u> ordinance, which is the culmnination of a year-long outreach and deliberation by the Cupertino Sustainability Division and regional partners at Silicon Valley Clean Energy.
