

Cupertino's Citywide Garage Sale: Sellers Guide

Advertising

- The City will buy several ads in the Cupertino Courier, Silicon Valley Community Newspapers throughout Santa Clara County and more. The City will also advertise on Cupertino.org, Craigslist and various social media outlets.
- The list and the map will be published on the city's website: <u>cupertino.org/garagesale</u>. All registered garage sales will be listed. The list includes addresses, cross streets, days of each sale, and a brief summary of items for sale.
- The City will hang a Garage Sale banner on Stevens Creek Boulevard in September.
- If you wish to list several unusual items, you may want to buy a small classified ad on your own.

Sign Rules:

Garage sale signs are prohibited from being placed anywhere in the public right of way including utility poles, stop signs, and stop lights. (Code 19.104.250)

- Do not place signs on sidewalk or roadway
- Do not nail signs onto a tree: it is harmful to the tree's health.
- Signs on park strip or on private property are **okay**
- Signs must be removed after end of the sale time

Tips for Setting Up your Sale:

- Display items so they can be easily identified.
- It is recommended to have least \$20 in \$1 bills and \$10 in quarters so you can make change.
- Reused boxes or bags can be handy to provide to your customers.
- Have newspaper handy to wrap breakable items.
- Remember the rules of conduct used by successful retailers: courtesy, friendliness, fair dealings and willingness to offer service.

Tips for Cleaning Up your Sale

- Do not leave items out after the end of the sale time. Please put all items back out of view per property maintenance code. Additional disposal options are below.
- Remove all signs from the yard and neighborhood.

Acceptable items include: Books • Household items • Clothing • Shoes • Accessories • Toys • E-Waste (computers, phones, video game consoles, TV's under 27 inches)

Unacceptable items include: Furniture • Pillows • Food • Large Appliances • Construction Debris (lumber, concrete, bricks, etc) • Carpet • Liquids • Automobile Parts • Weapons • Chemicals • Medical or Pet Items • Items weighing more than 50 pounds
