# Bike Lane Construction

We are excited to announce that the City of Cupertino will begin implementing its Bicycle Transportation Plan in just a couple months! Construction of separated bikeways along McClellan Blvd (Imperial to Stelling) will begin in May and last approximately three months. Construction of separated bikeways along Stevens Creek Blvd (Wolfe to Tantau) is set to begin this summer and last approximately three months. Finally, two segments of the Bicycle Boulevard Network are due to be constructed this summer along Portal/Merritt and Greenleaf/Meteor. The purpose of this study is to identify potential nearterm bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure improvements along the Homestead Road Corridor. These improvements would support alternative transportation use and connect students to nearby; West Valley Elementary, Cupertino Middle, and Homestead High Schools.
