Fall Bike Fest 2018

On October 27th, 2018 Cupertino Safe Routes 2 School and the Bicycle Pedestrian Commission will host the 5th annual Fall Family Bike Fest featuring:

The Rides - Ride your freshly decorated bike on our family-friendly bike ride! Chose between a leisurely 5-mile ride (best for families) and a 14-mile "Spandex" ride, both touring city schools, parks, and landmarks. Ride routes coming soon.

The Food - The Bicycle Pedestrian Commission will bring its famous Bicycle Blender so riders can whip up healthy fruit smoothies using their own pedal power! There will be other quad-powering snacks as well.

Upcoming Construction on McClellan Blvd.

Project Description

The McClellan Road Bikeway Improvement Project is a multi-phase project to install separated/Class IV bike lanes on McClellan Road between Torre Avenue and Imperial Avenue.

The Phase 1a project will provide a physical separation between motor vehicles and bicyclists. The work includes shifting the northern side-walk north to create a bit more room for the improvements. Once that is done, raised bicycle curbs 18 inches wide will be installed to define and separate the bike lane. Posts will be added to increase visibility of the bicycle curbs.

The next phase (1b) to be constructed will be modify the existing traffic signals at McClellan/Bubb and McClellan/Stelling. It is anticipated that there will be 2 additional phases to complete the McClellan Separated Bikeways.

Benefits

The project will enhance the bicycle lanes, adding a raised physical barrier to more effectively separate cars and trucks from bicyclists. Phase 1b will add features at traffic signals to better detect and serve bicycles.

Schedule

Construction on the 1a phase of the project is anticipated to begin in October of 2018 and will take about 3 months to complete.
