Infrastructure Update

Construction on the McClellan Road separated bike lanes, Phase 2, is in full swing and is expected to last two to three moths.

On Tuesday, August 18, Cupertino City Council approved the Stevens Creek Blvd Class IV Phase 1 construction contract.

The Mary Avenue Protected Bike Lanes project is undergoing Final Design. City engineers are finalizing the project's striping plans. The City plans to bid/award a construction contract in the fall and anticipates completing the project before the end of the calendar year.

The City of Cupertino has adopted a community-based Neighborhood Traffic Calming Program (NTCP) to address local neighborhood traffic safety issues. Review the program here.
