



After our years of working in the non-profit and bike arena, we know that...


For low-income families, people without housing, refugees, veterans and others, bicycles are more than an essential means of transportation

Bicycles **confer intangible assets** like confidence, resourcefulness, and independence

Bicycles **provide a sense of agency** that enables people to play an active role in their lives and their community










New Program Announced Today!



• Bicycle Exchange and Service Program

- Exchange any unsafe bike with a new refurbished one and a lock
 - Also exchange any corporate fleet bike
- Provide free, no questions asked mobile repair clinics in partnership with Dignity on Wheels
 - Initially one a week but growing to 3 a week
- Actively provide bike to people in need by running a "earn-a-bike" program with partner non-profits
 - 6 hours volunteering in exchange for bike and a lock
- Details distributed by partners, Corporate Bike Recovery teams, police and other community groups




Presence

Target to have 4 Retail Shops to service core areas of demand

Service centers located in ~20 low income housing complexes

Conduct up to 3-4 mobile clinics a week




