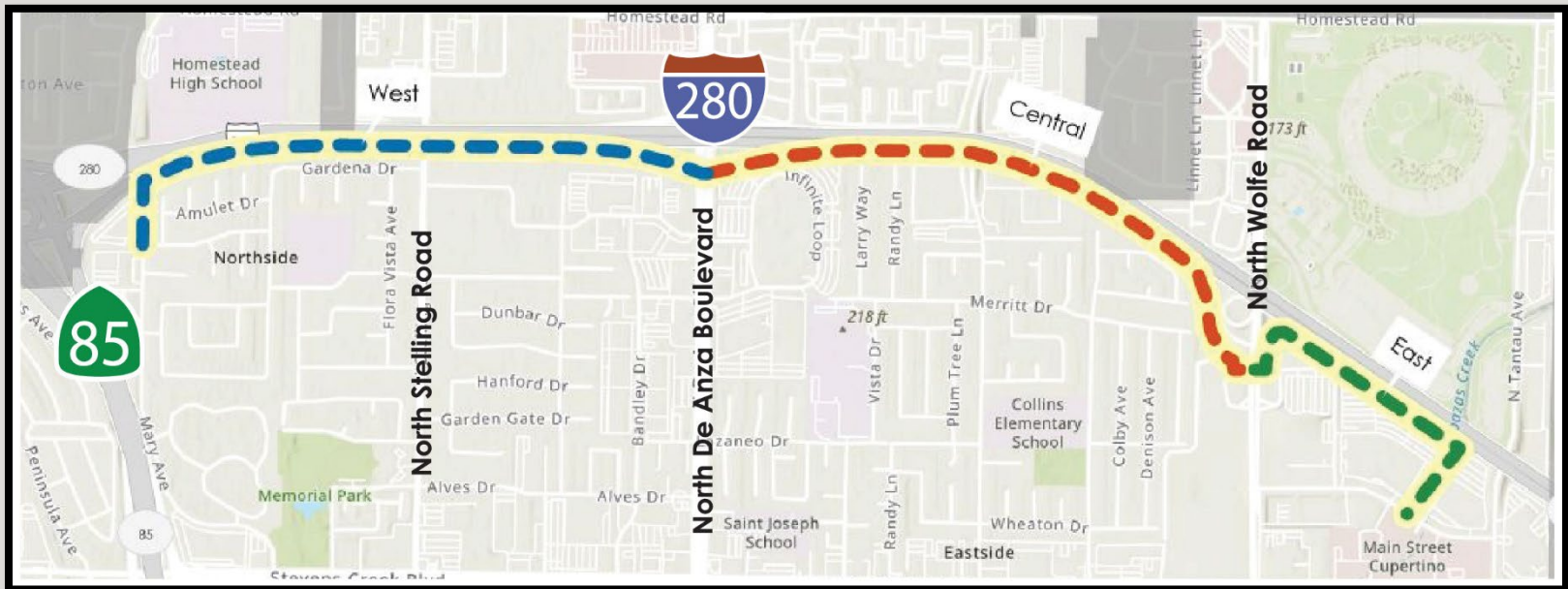

I-280 Trail



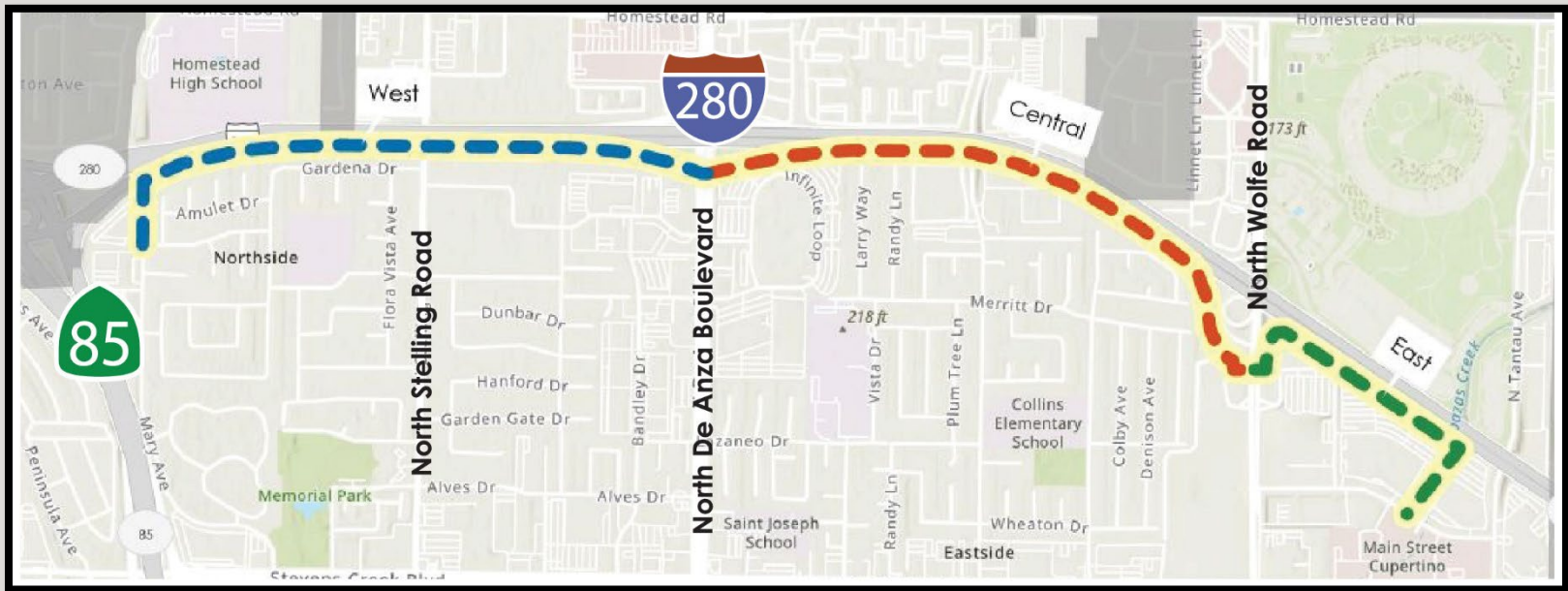

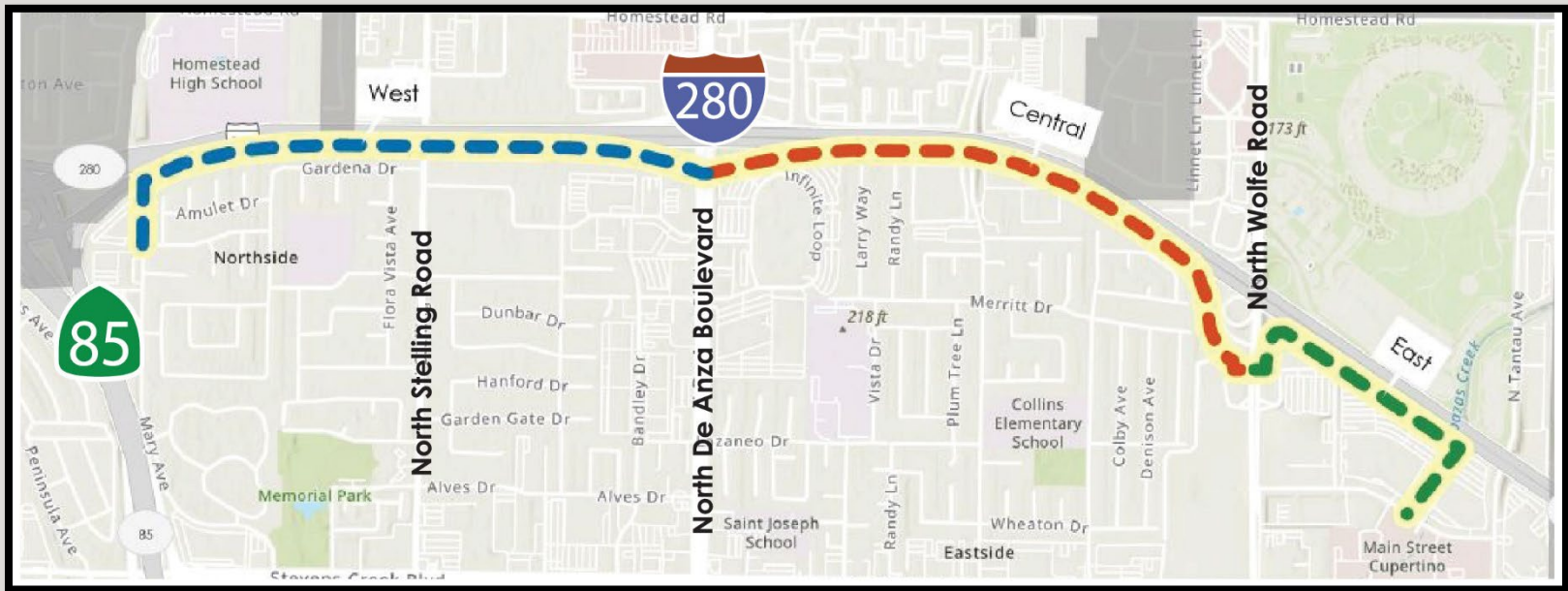

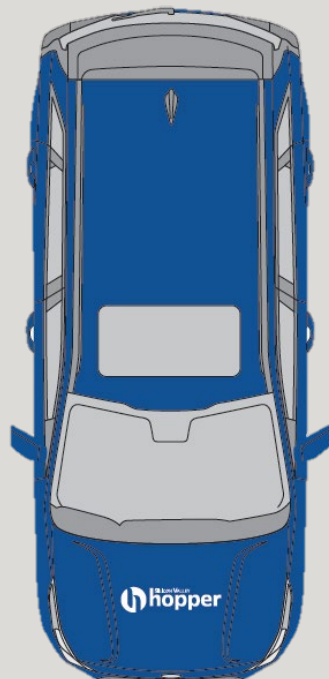

All County of Santa Clara K-12 Schools are Invited to Participate!

In celebration of Bike to School Month, students, families, and school staff are encouraged to track their miles and minutes of active transportation during the week of May 15th-21st.

Participants earn "moon miles" by biking, walking, rolling, learning about traffic safety, and posting their activities on social media; with the goal of collectively "biking" all the way to the moon, 286,900 miles away!

1. REGISTER YOUR SCHOOL

Schools should register hereby May 5th. Schools will be provided promotional materials and posters. The first 20 schools to register will receive 150 bike lights to give away to students.

2. PROMOTE BIKING

Post flyers, make announcements, and encourage students to bike to school

3. TRACK YOUR MOON MILEAGE

During the week of May 15th-21st, students should track and enter their activities on the [Moon Mileage Tracking form](#). Form opens May 15th at 7am and closes May 22nd at 5pm.

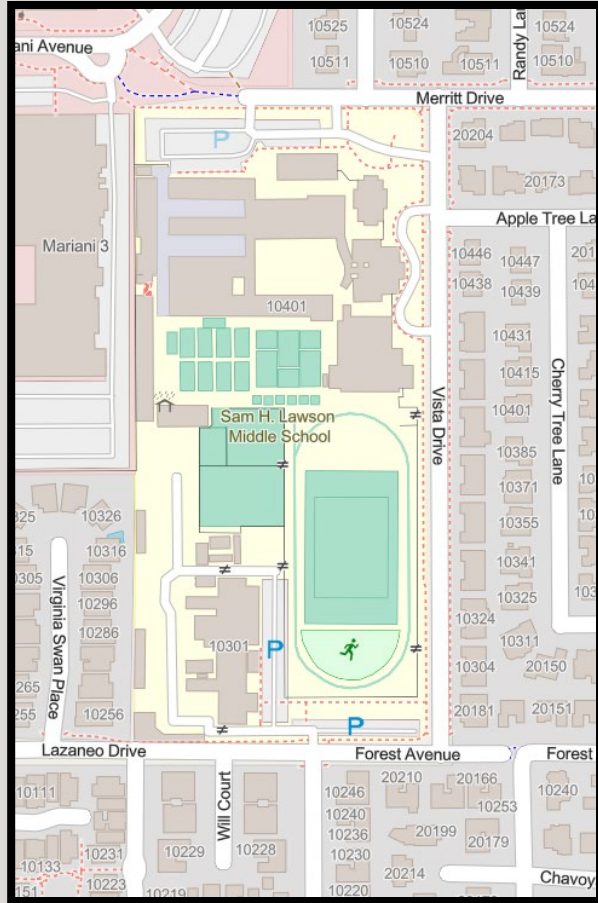
