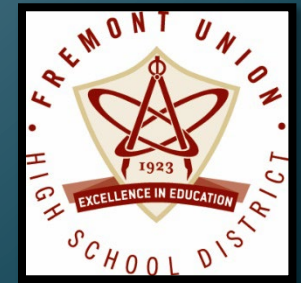

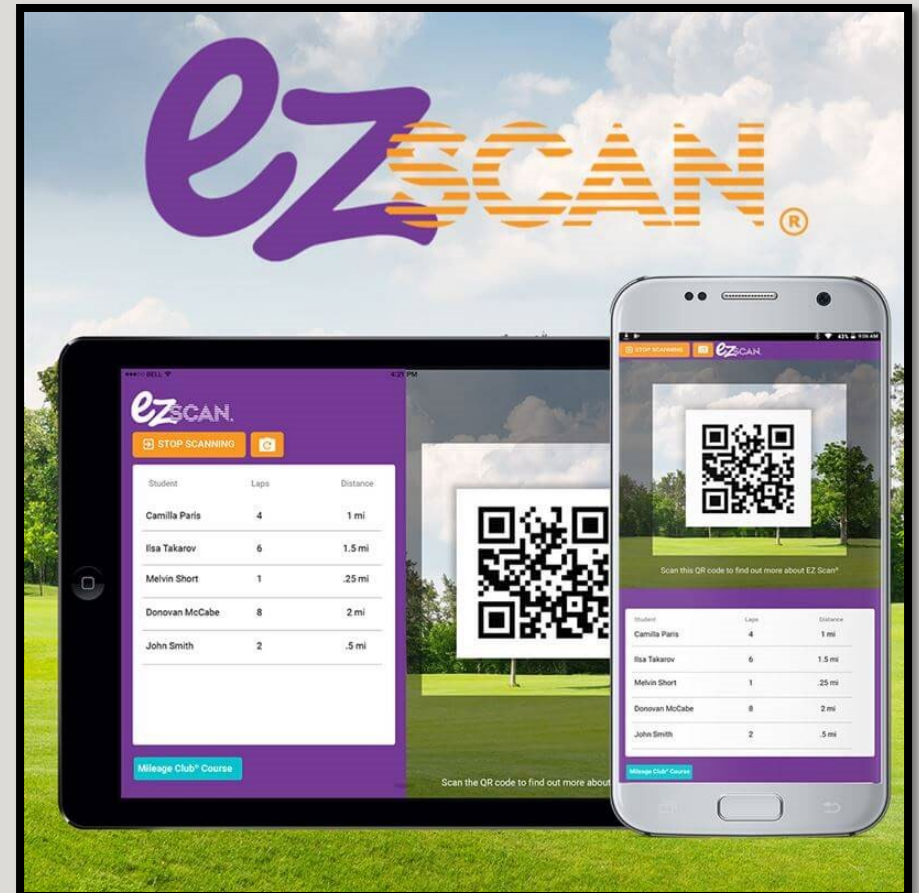

In celebration of Bike to School Month, students, families, and school staff are encouraged to track their miles and minutes of active transportation during the week of May 16th-20th.

Participants earn "moon miles" by biking, walking, rolling, learning about traffic safety, and posting their activities on social media; with the goal of collectively "biking" all the way to the moon, 286,900 miles away!

1. REGISTER YOUR SCHOOL:

Schools should register [here](http://www.sccphd.org/walkbikerevents) by May 6th. Schools will be provided promotional materials and posters. The first 18 schools to register will receive 120 bike lights to give away to students, courtesy of Silicon Valley Bicycle Coalition.

2. PROMOTE BIKING:

Post flyers, make announcements, and encourage students to bike to school

3. TRACK YOUR MOON MILEAGE:
