City of Cupertino: 2010 Community Tracking Survey Topline Report October 2010

The City of Cupertino commissioned Godbe Research to conduct a survey of its residents to learn their overall perceptions of living in the city and to gauge their satisfaction with the City's performance in providing services and programs to its residents. The survey also focused on gathering feedback on other resident issues in the city including parks and recreation, transportation choices, sustainability, economic development and housing, crime, ethnic diversity, library hours, and information sources.

SURVEY METHODOLOGY

The respondents for this study were selected using a sample of registered voters in the City of Cupertino. Overall, 400 residents in the city completed the survey, representing a total universe of approximately 37,083 adult residents. The study parameters resulted in a margin of error of plus or minus 4.9 percent. Interviews were conducted from September 12 through September 19, 2010, and the average interview length was approximately 20 minutes.

Once collected, the sample of respondents was compared with the adult population in the City of Cupertino according to the 2007 Population Estimates to examine possible differences between the demographics of the sample of respondents and the actual universe of residents. The data were weighted to correct these differences, and the results presented are representative of the adult resident characteristics in terms of gender, age, and ethnicity.

QUESTIONNAIRE METHODOLOGY

To avoid the problem of systematic position bias, where the order in which a series of questions is asked systematically influences the answers, several questions in the survey were randomized such that the respondents were not consistently asked the questions in the same order. The series of items in Questions 6, 7, 14 and 15 were randomized to avoid such position bias.

Questions 3, 9, 12, 16, 30, 34, and F allowed the residents surveyed to mention multiple responses. For this reason, the response percentages may sum to more than 100, and these represent the percent of the respondents that mentioned a particular response, rather than the percent of total responses.

MEAN SCORES AND ROUNDING

In addition to the percentage breakdown of responses to each question, results for the questions relating to the satisfaction with city services (Q6), satisfaction with the parks and recreation services (Q7), and frequency of adoption green and sustainable living practices (Q14) include a mean score. For example, to derive respondents' overall satisfaction with a City service or program (Q6), a number value is first assigned to each response category (in this case, "Very Satisfied" = +2, "Somewhat Satisfied" = +1, "Somewhat Dissatisfied" = -1, and "Very Dissatisfied" = -2). The individual answer of each respondent is then assigned the corresponding number – from +2 to -2 in this example. Finally, all respondents' answers are averaged to produce a final score that reflects overall importance. The resulting mean score makes the interpretation of the data considerably easier. Responses of "Don't Know" (DK/NA) were not included in the calculations of the means for any question.

Conventional rounding rules apply to the percentages shown in this report, .5 or above is rounded up to the next number, and .4 or below is rounded down to the previous number. As a result, the percentages may not add up to 100 percent.

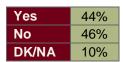
