SAFE ROUTES SCHOOL UPDATE April 2017





3rd Grade Bike/Pedestrian Education!

Cupertino SR2S is working with CUSD and local elementary schools to pilot in-class, bicycle and pedestrian safety lessons for 3rd grade students. These one-hour lessons will engage students through interactive activities and a presentation about rules of the road and safety tips for cyclists and pedestrians. The goals of the lesson? 1) Teach kids as young as 3rd grade that riding their bike and/or walking is a fun

and viable form of transportation and 2) Help students realize the importance of walking and biking safely. Safe Routes 2 School believes that the earlier kids learn about walking and biking and the more that schools encourage these behaviors, the greater the chance this education has to impact behavior throughout students' lives. 3rd grade lessons will begin this month at West Valley, Sedgwick, Stevens Creek, and Eaton Elementary schools.



SR2s Announces New Sidewalk Law: Kids 12 and Under Can Ride

Kids ages 12 and under can now legally ride their bikes on sidewalks in the City of Cupertino! On February 21st, 2017 Cupertino amended its Muni Code to raise the maximum sidewalk riding age from 9-12 years old in order to allow all Elementary

School students to legally ride on the sidewalk. Adults acommpanying a 12 and under child are also legally allowed to bike on sidewalks. With this new city law comes new opportunities and new responsibilities to ride safely.

Safety Tips for sidewalk riding:

- 1) Always ride in the same direction as traffic, even when on the sidewalk
- 2) Sidewalk speed is 10 MPH maximum
- 3) You must dismount from your bike at intersections
- 4) If an adjacent bike lane is available, use the bike lane instead of the sidewalk
