WALK AUDITS SCHEDULED AT FIVE MORE CUPERTINO SCHOOLS

In order to address infrastructure needs and traffic concerns at schools, Cupertino SR2S is funding walk audits for all schools in our city. Walk audits are assessments of the walkability, bikeability, pedestrian access, and cyclist access to schools and are intended to address deficiencies in the infrastructure in the vicinty of a school. Cupertino SR2S is working with Alta Planning and Design to conduct these

walk audits and has completed audits at Lincoln Elementary, Monta Vista High School, and Homestead High School so far. Over the next two months, SR2S will conduct these audits at five more Cupertino schools. We are looking for parent volunteers!
