Cupertino's First "Walking School Bus"



On May 3rd Lincoln Elementary School kicked off its "Walk on Wednesdays" campaign with Walk to School Day prizes, balloons, and an inaugural Walking School Bus! A Walking School Bus is a pedestrian carpool that allows parents to drop off their kids at pre-determined, chaperoned meeting points away from a school so that groups of students and adult leaders can walk together safely and reduce traffic congestion around the school. These programs are popular throughout the country and Lincoln added Cupertino to the map by becoming the first school in the city to adopt this program. The bus included two meeting points and gathered close to 15 walkers!

Bay Area Bike to Work Day

Cupertino celebrated Bay Area Bike to Work Day in style by hosting an energizer station where Bicycle Pedestrian Commissioners handed out free coffee and snacks to passing cyclists. City of Cupertino has hosted an energizer station for over 10 years and will continue to do so to support its cycling community. City staff also celebrated Bike to Work Day with a team of cyclists competing in the National Bike Month challenge, with some staff members toting rides of over 20 miles to work!
